## Collections Held in the Archives

The collection consists of papers from the National Press Club including audio and video of National Press Club events. In addition, the National Press Club Archives is home to the Women's National Press Club/Washington Press Club Archives, National Press Building, the Society of American Travel Writers Archives, the Society of Professional Journalists DC Chapter Archives, American Women in Radio and Television DC Chapter Archives, and several small collections.
