Description	Known as The Traipsin' Woman, Jean Thomas traveled the mountains of eastern Kentucky taking snapshot photographs of the mountain way of life, writing, and promoting mountain folkways. She was particularly interested in the music, crafts, and language patterns of the area. Included in the Photographic Archives collection are 1,077 negatives taken by Jean Thomas during her travels throughout the eastern Kentucky mountains. The images document musical instruments, quilts, baskets, and other crafts, and scenes with community and family groups.
